BURYAT

Our church adopted an unreached people group called the Buryats in 2003

The Buryats are the largest ethnic minority group in Siberia and are mainly concentrated in their homeland, the Buryat Republic (Buryatia), a federal subject of Russia. The Buryat Republic, has a population of almost one million. It is located in the South-Central region of Siberia along the eastern shore of Lake Baikal.

Today, the majority of Buryats live in and around Ulan-Ude, the capital of the republic, although many live more traditionally in the countryside. The official language is Russian. They also speak in a dialect of the Mongolian language called Buryat. The Buryats are the northernmost major Mongol group. Buryats share many customs with their Mongolian cousins, including nomadic herding and erecting yurts for shelter.

The combination of the influences of Buddhism, Shamanism of indigenous peoples, and Old Russian Orthodox Christianity has formed the spiritual sphere of the society in Buryatia.

The most ancient traditional religion of Buryats have been Shamanists since the oldest times. In the mid-17th century, the first Russian Orthodox churches and chapels appeared in Buryatia, and some time later, Mongol and Tibetan lamas (Buddhist priests) came to Buryatia to actively spread Buddhism among Buryats. In 1741, the Tibetan branch of Buddhism was recognized as one of the official religions in Russia, and the first Buryat datsan (Buddhist monastery) was built. In 1991 the Buddhists of the Republic celebrated the 250th anniversary of official recognition of Buddhism in Russia.

In 1917, 44 datsans (Buddhist temples), 144 minor temples, 211 Russian Orthodox temples, 81 Old Russian Orthodox Believers' prayer houses, 7 Jewish synagogues, 6 Moslem mosques, 5 Baptist communities, and 1 Catholic church were located on the territory of Buryatia. By mid-30's all of these places of worship had been closed, and it was not until the last decades of the 20th century that their restoration began. A revival of Buddhism has taken place since the late 1980s.

Today there are 14 Buddhist datsans, 12 Buddhist communities, 17 Orthodox temples and parish churches, 7 Ancient Russian Orthodox communities, and over 20 religious denominations and movements of various kinds in Buryatia. Shamanism is still strong in some regions of Buryatia.

Kallie Knaus, Pastor Ron Sisco, Rachel (Kay) Lemman and Tom Moldenhauer joined River Valley Community Church in Grants Pass Oregon on a two week trip to Ulan Ude in June of 2005. Much has happened since this visit to our adopted people group. ***A detailed sheet of prayer requests and updates on the outreach to the Buryat people is located on the Communications Table in the foyer.***

Food for Thought...A Challenge to be Thinking Christians



Self-Sufficient

As the typical day unfolds, the unexpected expectedly happens. With one eye on the clock and another on our schedule, we can often watch our planning derail throughout the day. And as I realize my plans for the day will not be flawlessly executed, my soul has a tendency to be weighed down by accumulating cares. But rather than humbling myself as I should, I find myself vulnerable to self-sufficiency, at risk of relying upon my limited strength and wisdom. This is pride.

If we are not watchful, our burdens will subtly accumulate over time, and will gradually weigh down our soul. But it doesn't need to be this way. There is a biblical alternative.

Casting Pride and Casting Cares

Scripture calls us to cast all our anxieties on God, because he cares for us.

6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, **7 casting all your anxieties on him**, because he cares for you. ([1 Peter 5:6–7, ESV](#))

Casting all my cares upon the Lord is a means of humbling myself before the Lord. In reading these passages we discover that casting our cares upon the Lord falls under the command to humble ourselves. Casting our cares is an expression of humility. When I fail to cast my cares upon him, I display prideful self-sufficiency.

A Few Words of Prayer

As I make my way from meeting to meeting, decision to decision, and phone call to phone call, I find the counsel of Charles Spurgeon very helpful. "I always feel it well," he wrote, "to put a few words of prayer between everything I do." Throughout his busy days, Spurgeon scattered words of prayer between each activity, a model I have sought to emulate over the years.

The content of my "few words of prayer" is not unique and if you overheard them, you wouldn't be impressed. I am a simple man and when I think of casting all my cares it is a simple acknowledgement of my dependence upon God and my need of grace throughout the day.

But the very act of pausing in a busy day to pray is an act of weakening pride in my life, acknowledging that I am a dependent creature. I am not self-sufficient.

And taking a brief moment to humble myself in prayer makes all the difference in my soul throughout the day.

At its root, weariness is often the result of pride and self-sufficiency in my life. When I neglect casting my cares upon the Lord, the heavy fatigue of weariness will settle into my soul.

Casting our cares upon the Lord and humbling ourselves before him are critical activities, regardless of how busy we are. And this practice cannot be replaced by hours of careful planning and scheduling.

How about you? Do you follow the practice of Spurgeon and "put a few words of prayer" between everything you do throughout each day? Are you casting cares or accumulating burdens? Are you humbling yourself before the Lord or displaying self-sufficiency?

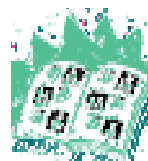

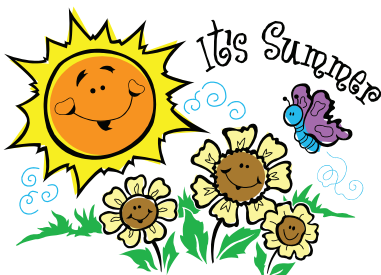
