

Pete grew up in a Christian home, the son of a pastor. All he ever knew was Christianity. He prayed the sinner's prayer when he was six but the idea of having a relationship with God never sunk in until he was thirteen. It was then that he rededicated his life to God. Since then, God has been growing Pete up in Him - constantly changing him and making him stronger in his faith.

He went to college with the desire to work with teens. While at Cedarville he began taking missions classes that God really used to work in his heart. At the time he was considering doing youth work overseas. Through these same classes, God eventually brought out a burden for the poor and for the city. It was through these classes and the professor, Dr. Jeff Cook, that God brought him to work in the city.

Pete serves as a Youth Pastor and is responsible for the evangelism, discipleship, and mentoring of students age 7-18 in a south side Chicago neighborhood called Woodlawn. His week-to-week responsibilities include overseeing tutoring programs, the Awana program, small group Bible studies, and a monthly worship service. There are also various other activities, such as summer camps, that give him a chance to spend time with the students and strengthen their relationships.

Pete is transitioning into a leadership role, leading the Youth Outreach team. His program responsibilities will largely stay the same, but with increased oversight of all youth programs. In addition, Sunshine has started a monthly worship service, with the hope of planting a church in the future. Pete has taken a leadership role in planning these services as well.

Pete and Nikki were married in 2007. Nikki has been taking classes at Moody Bible Institute, pursuing a Youth Ministry degree. She serves as a Youth Ministry Assistant at Sunshine Gospel Ministries, volunteering at different programs and discipling Jr. High girls.

The culture in their community is definitely American, but there are great differences than most of America. There is a strong sense of community within their neighborhood. There is great loyalty to family and to each other. There is quite a bit of joy within the culture and a real celebration of accomplishments and everyday things. Even though some negative things surround it, the culture itself is very bright and beautiful.

Current needs for prayer on the field:

- 1) Transition into a leadership role over their Youth Outreach staff
- 2) Safe and peaceful summer as they finish their school year
- 3) Wisdom as they seek out a possible church plant at Sunshine



Food for Thought...A Challenge to be Thinking Christians



Is the Christian faith really rational?

By all means! It is intensely rational. Now, I've had the question asked of me, "Is it true that you are a Christian rationalist?" I said, "By no means! That's a contradiction in terms. A rationalist is somebody who embraces a philosophy that sets itself over and against Christianity." And so, while a true Christian is not a rationalist, the Christian faith is certainly rational.

Is Christianity coherent? Is it intelligible? Does it make sense? Does it fit together in a consistent pattern of truth, or is it the opposite of rational—is it irrational? Does it indulge in superstition and embrace Christians who believe that Christianity is manifestly irrational? I think that's a great tragedy. The God of Christianity addresses people's minds. He speaks to us. We have a Book that is written for our understanding.

When I say that Christianity is rational, I do not mean that the truth of Christianity in all of its majesty can be deduced from a few logical principles by a speculative philosopher. There is much information about the nature of God that we can find only because God himself chooses to reveal it to us. He reveals these things through his prophets, through history, through the Bible, and through his only begotten Son, Jesus.

But what he reveals is intelligible; we can understand it with our intellect. He doesn't ask us to throw away our minds in order to become Christians. There are people who think that to become a Christian, one must leave one's brain somewhere in the parking lot. The only leap that the New Testament calls us to make is not into the darkness but out of the darkness into the light, into that which we can indeed understand. That is not to say that everything the Christian faith speaks of is manifestly clear with respect to rational categories. I can't understand, for example, how a person can have a divine nature and a human nature at the same time, which is what we believe about Jesus. That's a mystery—but mysterious is not the same as irrational.

Mystery doesn't apply only to religion. I don't understand the ultimate force of gravity. These things are mysterious to us, but they're not irrational. It's one thing to say, "I don't understand from my finite mind how these things work out," and it's another thing to say, "They're blatantly contradictory and irrational, but I'm going to believe them anyway." That's not what Christianity does. Christianity says that there are mysteries, but those mysteries cannot be articulated in terms of the irrational; if that were so, then we have moved away from Christian truth.
