## **Beacon of Hope**

## Teen Service (Missions) Trip Boston, MA June 28-July 4



#### What Will We Be Doing?

From June 28-July 4 First Baptist Church will send a group of 17 to serve alongside Open Air Campaigners (Paintboard Ministry) in Boston, MA. Our trip is going to be facilitated by Brian Harmon. We will be doing a 5-day kids club in a neighborhood 2 blocks from the church (we start the 5-Day Kid's Club on Sunday afternoon). We will do some adult outreaches in downtown Boston. Throughout the week, there will be a few meetings for training and evangelism lectures. Wednesday p.m. we hope to do some evening ministry (blacklight) on the beach/boardwalk. We will be partnering some with members from Lighthouse; this is a great way to build a bridge from the community to the church.

#### How Can You Pray?

This trip is going to be a Spiritually challenging trip as it is going to require students to be bold in the proclamation of the Gospel. Pray that God would already be working in our hearts of our students, and of the people who will hear the Gospel through our students on the trip.

#### What is the Cost?

<u>Prophet, Priest, & King: The Three Offices of Christ</u> by R. Albert Mohler Jr. (B&H Books)

In this book, Al Mohler delves into the historical significance of the offices of prophet, priest, and king. He traces their origins in the Old Testament to their ultimate fulfillment in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Mohler presents a compelling argument: the three offices should not be compartmentalized. They are interconnected and essential for Christian faithfulness in the home, the church, and society. #### **AM Sermon Notes**

#### Message - A Lifetime of Faith that Started with His Mother Hebrews 11:23-29 Pastor Tim Knaus

#### I. Decisions

A. Each day, a Christian man or woman has to make decisions that involve either obeying or disobeying God.

Deuteronomy 30:19-20a

Joshua 24:15

1 Kings 18:21 (NIV 84)

B. In our quest to live by faith, Satan will always make disobedience appear to be attractive, comfortable, and pleasurable.

#### II. Five Decisions

- A. The life of Moses can be summed up by five decisions: decisions to believe God and obey God.
- B. Every decision in Moses' life can be traced back to his obedient and God-fearing mother.

#### Here is how you can accept Christ into your life:

- Admit your need. (*I am a sinner*)
- Be willing to turn from your sins. (Repent)
- Believe that Jesus Christ died for you on the cross and rose from the grave. (*Be saved by faith*)
- Through prayer, invite Jesus Christ to control your life through the Holy Spirit. (*Receive him as Lord and Savior*)

#### We suggest a prayer like this one:

"Dear God, I know I'm a sinner, and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe Jesus Christ is Your Son. I believe that He died for my sin and that you raised Him to life. I want to trust Him as my Savior and follow Him as Lord, from this day forward. Guide my life and help me to do your will. I pray this in the name of Jesus. Amen."
